Personal Search: I volunteer at the Minter Field Air Museum in Shafter, California. During a bull session one evening, I mentioned that my father, Mathew L. Ward from Antioch California, flew for Transocean back around 1949-1953. My older sister and conversations with Dad are my only sources. Steve Manning here at the museum loaned me a copy of *Folded Wings*. Marvelous



book. My questions are: Would you folks have any personnel records going back that far? I should like any information you might be able to give on Dad's employment with Transocean -- again sometime around 1949 to 1953. My last question is: How may I purchase a

copy of *Folded Wings*? I can't seem to find it anywhere. I would be more than willing to compensate for the effort. If we can confirm Dad's flying for Transocean, I would like to join your Association.

My information is that my dad flew First Officer. He may have made Captain, but I'm not sure, neither is my sister. The story that is told is that Dad had a difficult time getting on board with Transocean. He flew P-38's in the South Pacific and was highly decorated. But the airlines considered them fighters and not applicable to multi-engine time as would bombers. He went to TALOA Academy and got his ATR and Transocean hired him. He first tried with Flying Tigers. A neighbor, William Brown, across the street in San Lorenzo, flew for Tigers and tried to get Dad on there but failed.

I talked with my sister again yesterday. She remembered that Dad flew the Oakland -Hawaii - Wake - Guam - Okinawa route. I have no pictures that would definitely prove his employment. I have several that my sister believes were take on layovers in Hawaii. His youthful looks almost certainly puts the pictures in that time frame. Thanks for any help you might be able to give me. And a later email...Hi Jeff, I think I may have found what your father was doing during a certain period of time from the remarks in one of my father's logbooks. The other pilots he listed were Claude Turner, Russ Steinhauer, & Bill Keating. Looks like during this period

of time they were mostly flying DC4s. The dates are from Nov 5th to Dec 17th, 1949. Your father may very well have flown the Honolulu run with crew other than my father, but my father's log books show our dads flew together on numerous flights to Alaska. Take a look at these images (attached to email correspondence) I made of 3 pages in my dad's log books. Take care, Jeane



Jeane, This is very exciting! Dad had flown to Alaska many times and told some hilarious stories about the trips. I've flown up there with him several times although much later. He never mentioned Transocean that I recall. My sister, Helen is quite certain that Dad flew the Oakland to the Orient route before he left the airline. It's quite probable that he flew with your father in another capacity to get some experience. It's unlikely that a newly minted ATR would get his own ship over more experienced pilots. By the way, Dad kept his ATR until he died in 1969. That rating opened a lot of doors for him in General Aviation.

I'm sending 4 pictures that I hope might help me find someone who remembers my father. #1&2 is me and Dad (Matt). I'm told I was 6



months old here. This would place the picture around August 1953. Keep the chuckles about my size to yourself!! Dad had just bought me those jeans and Mom positively hated them. My sister said that Mom



would throw them away and Dad would just buy more. Mom finally gave in but to the day she died she never bought jeans for ANYONE in the family. #3 is a barrack's shot in his "goatskin"...looks new. This was taken around 1945.



#4 is Dad in his p-38 "Antioch Ape", in Dec. 1944. Thanks again for all your help, Jeff

Little Kids...Big Memories


Aloha, John Foster!

Thank you, John Foster, for bringing some of my childhood memories out of the shadows. I remembered spending vacations in Hawaii, but few details.

When I read your account (*Ed...Oct 2008 newsletter*), I could almost smell the plumeria in the air! This photo of my sister Kathy, my dad Joe Stachon, mom Bettie, and me, was taken in 1952.

As you said, Waikiki Beach was a long expanse of golden sand, with only the Royal Hawaiian, Moana, and Outrigger Club taking up space. I now remember the 'open air' Catholic Church on Sundays, *Hawaii Calls* at the Banyan Court, and eating at the Mayflower (there was one waitress who always made a big deal over us!) And, does anyone else remember a little house in that area, with a pet



mynah bird that could sing the *Star-Spangled Banner*!? Or how about riding a Galapagos tortoise at the Honolulu

association. I originally volunteered just to be a roving reporter, but ended up writing the second newsletter and published 3 a year for the next 22 years.

I originally worked with Red Emery, who took care of the graphics/printing until he passed away, then I took over the entire newsletter. We had more than 500 members at the time.

Fortunately, I had access to Red's collection of films, photographs, etc., Then Jeff Nelson took over and did a good job as editor for quite a while. Now you are the editor and doing a fine job. You understand all the latest technology. I am computer challenged but did manage to get the newsletter out and keep the former employees of TAL together."


"In the meantime, I spent 25 years collecting all of the memorabilia (still doing it) for the TAL exhibit at the Oakland Aviation Museum (and getting photos and posters framed and secured to the wall). I had help from Tom Northrop (friend of TAL) in mounting the rest of the photographs, otherwise that would have been an overwhelming job. I chaired TAL's 50th reunion, published a small booklet in commemoration, put together a video of TAL's golden years for the occasion, and also wrote *Folded Wings - A History of Transocean Air Lines* over a 5-year period and sold it to a publisher. It came out in 1989, and is now out of print, although occasionally a copy becomes available on eBay or Amazon.com
